Let me introduce you to an English language edition of our quar-terly, as always divided into subject sections. The first section, *Social and Economic Policy*, includes two articles. Anna Ciepielewska-Kowalik reflects on the role of parents and teachers in primary education, a topic extremely hot in the contemporary Polish political debate. Barbara Kijewska, Sylwia Mrozowska and Dobrosław Mańkowski deal with policies addressed to women during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The *Political Thought* section includes reflections by Łukasz Święcicki on the compatibility or incompatibility of Libertarianism and Monarchism.

Monika Jabłońska's article on the US-Holy See relations in the Reagan era focuses on an important factor in these relations concerning the role of Pope John Paul II at that time. We publish this article under the heading *International Relations*.

Social Memory which is the title of the next section seems an increasingly interesting aspect of international relations. Here Tomasz Stryjek offers his reflections on the sources of memory conflict between Poland and Ukraine.

This copy of *Political Studies* is, as always, concluded with a review of a monograph on economic security dimension of the Three Seas Initiative by Marta Dębska.
